We have fabulous outdoor provision and <u>all</u> children have continuous access to outdoors for the whole session. As a result of their play and exploration, children may need to change their clothing. Please could you ensure that your child has a change of clothes.

As we move closer to colder weather please ensure you layer your child up with appropriate clothing. If you haven't done so already you may want to consider buying a school sweatshirt to wear over the top of a long-sleeved top. Please provide a suitable coat and label with your child's name.

Snack Money Payment

The charge for snack can be found on the school website under the 'Parents' then 'New Starters' tabs. Charges don't cover the schools costs but are a contribution and also go towards little extras like birthday and Christmas gifts for all the children. Some families choose to pay for the full school year, most pay termly but you also have the option to pay half termly. Charges for the term are £16 for children attending 15 hours and £32 for those who attend for 30 hours and are based on all families paying the amount due. We take card payments at the office and would much prefer parents/carers to use this option if at all possible. We understand, however, that a small number of you may prefer to pay by cash. You will receive a text message as a reminder when fees are due.

We understand that there may be rare occasions where you may be late to collect your child from nursery. Unfortunately, a very small number of parents are late on a regular basis. Doors close at 11.30 for am sessions and 3.30 for pm. Between sessions all staff supervise lunch club and have a limited amount of time for their own lunch before cleaning and setting up for the next session. After school staff also have a number of school commitments. Regular late collection is something I will be monitoring this half term as we consider making charges for persistent late collection.

We hope you are all enjoying viewing the photos and observations of learning staff share on Tapestry each week. We love to read parent/carers comments on these posts and the images you share of your child's home learning. The information you provide helps staff to learn more about your child's interests and

engagement in learning at home.

Home Learning—Staff also post a range of weekly home learning activities on Tapestry. As partners in your child's learning and development it is important that you support your child to complete these activities, many of which will enable them to gain extra practice and link experiences they have had in nursery. Please log in to Tapestry regularly throughout each week to ensure you keep up to date with these home learning challenges. If you have any questions about home learning or are having difficulty accessing Tapestry please speak to your child's key worker who will be happy to help

Attendance

Please ring the office: 623640 or text: 07415 869045 if your child will not be attending nursery. Make sure your contact details are up to date. We discourage you taking holidays during term time as it is very disruptive to your child's progress. We aim for 97% attendance which equates to just 6 days absence over the year. Obviously this might be taken up with illness so holiday absence on top of this may hinder your child's progress. The final page of the newsletter shows how we monitor attendance what we do if we have any concerns.

How do I know my child is making progress in nursery?

Staff use Tapestry to share children's learning with parents and carers. The notes (observations) they write are linked to the areas of learning as well as providing information about how they learn and their levels of wellbeing and involvement. Throughout each half term staff post a range of observations and at the end of the half term will send you a short post which shows whether your child is 'on track' as well as some next steps. These are things you can do at home to support your child's progress and learning. If you have any questions about your child's progress, please speak to their key worker who will be happy to help.

If you would like to talk to someone about any issues you or your family may be facing please speak to Kirsten or Marcia who will be happy to help.

Additional sessions and wrap around care

Due to the reduced number of children at the start of the year we are able to offer parents of **children in Garden Room** the opportunity to purchase additional am or pm sessions as well as places for breakfast and after school club. If you need an occasional extra session to do some Christmas shopping, or just to take a break or are interested in purchasing more regular additional sessions, enabling your child to stay in garden room all day, please speak to a member of staff in the office (623640).

Reminder— The closing date for applications for Primary School admission is 16th January 2023. If you need any help accessing or completing the forms online or have any queries, please see Janet or Helen in the office.

Guidance to parents and carers on the schools attendance monitoring

Marcia and Kirsten monitor all children's attendance fortnightly to find out more about who hasn't been to nursery and the reasons why. The office tell us if parents/carers have contacted nursery to let us know your child is sick or any other reason they aren't in

We understand that children's can be off because they are ill or have appointments so when we review how often a child doesn't come to nursery we look at things like:

Whether they are off regularly on particular days, for example is a child regularly off on a Monday

Whether they are often off with the same illness – you don't need to keep your child off if they are well but have a cold If we have rung you about your child's absence, have you given us a reason they are off

Improving attendance

If we are concerned about your child's attendance at nursery we will continue to check on his regularly and:

Ask your child's key worker or room leader to have a chat with you to see how we can help you to bring your child to nursery everyday



If things don't improve we will send a letter out to you as a reminder of all the learning and opportunities to make friends your child is missing.





If your child is still regularly missing school Marcia or Kirsten will telephone you or may visit your home to make sure you and your family are safe and talk about how we can work together to help your child to attend

We will sent out a second letter inviting you to meeting with your child's room leader to talk about making a plan to help your child to come to school regularly





If your child is still missing lots of nursery sessions and the things we have tried already haven't helped, we will send you letter for a meeting with Marcia or Kirsten. If your family get support from people like a family support worker, social worker or health visitor, we will invite them too. At this meeting we will talk together about what extra support you need to help you to get your child to nursery each day. This may include an Early Help Assessment

We hope that we are able to work in partnership with you to improve your child's attendance. Good attendance at nursery will help your child to be happy and settled here and make good progress in their learning and development.

Unfortunately, if things don't improve following this process the school would need to consider whether to cancel your child's place at nursery. In the unlikely event that this needed to be done we would help you to find a different nursery and would need to let the Local Authority know that your child no longer attended Sandy Lane.
