It's about my child's progress. I don't feel informed through the Tapestry app and I have the impression that my child is not making progress recently.

Staff are available to talk with parents/carers briefly at drop off and/or collection. Parents/carers wanting a more formal chat are able to request a meeting with the room leader/keyworker. Observations posted by staff are linked to areas of development and staff summaries children's learning at the end of each term. Within this termly document there is also a prompt for parents/carers to make an appointment to speak with staff should they wish. We would urge parents/carers who have any questions about their child's progress to speak to their key worker. I also published a short article in our Spring 2 newsletter titled 'How do I know my child is making progress?' which you may find helpful. If you are experiencing difficulties accessing Tapestry a member of staff is available in the staffroom each Tuesday (Tapestry Tuesday) after drop off to help, there is guidance on our website under the parents tab or please just speak to a member of staff in your child's room. If you have any other suggestions on how we can keep you informed about your child's progress please let us know.

#### We also had the following comment:

Fabulous nursery and forest school. It's a hidden gem that we need to keep telling others about. Consistent dedicated staff and Rainbow room has been amazing for G and us. We would love to see 30 hours being offered at standard for those children able to do. We would love to offer 30 hours to all children who are entitled but simply don't have the capacity.

It is something we are currently exploring (see my response under 'What could we change or make better?') and 'watch this space!'  $\odot$ 

- Can you give an example of something Sandy Lane Nursery and Forest School has done which has made a positive difference to your child AND/OR you as a family.
  - 1) Have sent PECS cards home for us to use
  - 2) Supported with M's toilet training. Always supportive with any issues I have inside or outside of nursery with both girls
  - 3) Nursery staff have always gave me piece of mind in regards to my child. With his extra needs they have always cared for him how I would and the progress he has made with the environment is fantastic. I can't thank them enough
  - 4) K's speech has come on a lot, more than helped with his potty training, socialising and interacting with other children.
  - 5) Making it an easy and understandable process for further education help. Understanding D's needs and sensory issues and helping him to self-regulate. Always gives support and advice. Nothing is too much for the staff, always chatty and friendly. Understanding D's behaviours when he's having a bad morning.

- 7) My child is now asking to use the toilet and being open with wanting to use the toilet he has become more polite and grown up since being at nursery with other children

I love joining in with the meeting each term to help with ideas to help nursery, and love the chats with other parents/ carers has this has helped me a little bit with my confidence. My children love going to forest school each week and I enjoy joining them when we get chance. Seeing them getting so involved in the activities and the concentration and passion on the face fills me with so much delight.

# 20 What could we change or make better?

Lots of parents said 'Nothing' in addition to the other comments below:

- 1) Just keep doing what they are doing
- 2) Nothing needs to change about the nursery I like everything about the nursery.
- 3) I am more than happy
- 4) Perfect the way they are.
- 5) You are amazing
- 6) Nothing as it seems lovely and helpful and a nice place to be
- 7) I can't think of anything! It is excellent in all respects and will always be my first choice nursery.
- 8) I don't think there's is anything to change

We also had the following suggestions:

- Parents parking in disabled bays without a blue badge. I understand it's a busy carpark but as the
  parent of a sen child in a sen provision with a blue badge, it is important that access to these spaces
  aren't taken up by people who should not be using them. This is important due to safety, and we have
  disability badges for a reason.
- Abuse of blue badge parking by nursery families makes it difficult for disabled children attending. I
  realise this is difficult for you to do anything about.

We are aware that during busy periods it can be difficult to find a parking space, especially a blue badge space, due to this being a busy multi-use site. Unfortunately we aren't able to extend the car park so the staggered times for drop off and collection with the onsite PVI was established to try to reduce the number of families using the car park at any one time. Users from the different buildings on site are required to display a pass if they are staying longer than drop off or collection with the aim of ensuring only campus users are parking here and that they are parked appropriately. We also regularly patrol the car park to try to ensure people are parked correctly. To help further I have sent out reminders to other campus users. I do understand how frustrating it is when this situation occurs and will continue to all I can to alleviate this issue.

• Not making my child wear the wet suits on forest play on Wednesdays as he really hates them and I can see they make him upset and uncomfortable.

We encourage parents/carers to help change the children into the waterproofs for forest school. This clothing helps to keep the children warm, dry and protects thing like their everyday coats. We understand that this clothing can be unfamiliar to some children. If you talk with your child's key worker they can arrange for you to take a set of waterproofs home for your child, it may help your child to become more comfortable and familiar with these items. Alternatively, if you would prefer to purchase something your child is happier to wear and bring this into nursery staff can ensure this is available for forest school sessions.

- It would always be lovely to see more sneak peaks on Tapestry.
- H hasn't been at sandy lane for long, I would like to know more about what he's like at nursery but totally understand how many children there are and it would be difficult/impossible to keep parents updated all of the time
- More posting on Tapestry of activities with O

We all enjoy the observations and photos/videos staff post on Tapestry, and those posted by parents/carers too. As you can imagine these do take time to compile and posting more would reduce staff's key role of engaging with the children and supporting their learning and development. Staff are available for a brief chat at drop off/collection if you want to find out a little more about your child's day and for a more detailed conversation you can make an appointment to speak with the room leader or their key worker

A recommendation with Tapestry is I can get 30 plus emails a day sometimes. I then have to delete
them all. If replies from Parents or carers were set to go to staff rather than everybody, just a
suggestion ☺.

Great suggestion as I understand that this can be frustrating but unfortunately this facility isn't currently available on Tapestry. We will make enquiries to see if they are able to offer a solution.

• Talk to parents more about the child's progress

Staff are always available at drop off/collection for a brief chat and if you require a longer conversation we recommend you make an appointment to speak with the room leader/key worker. In addition to the regular Tapestry observations linked to learning children's progress is formally shared with parents/carers at the end of each term. At this time parents/carers are also invited to speak with their child's key worker if there are any issues they wish to discuss although, if you do have any questions about your child's progress please don't feel you have to wait until this time, If you have any other suggestions on how we can share children's progress please speak to your child's room leader.

• my baby cries a lot when I left him at school and I wish the staff would take better care of him after my departure

Our staff are very experienced in helping children to settle in and we are aware that sometime children can appear distressed when separating from parents/carers at the start of the session. Staff are always on hand for a cuddle or to distract children. We usually find that children do settle quickly once parents/carers have left and staff often post a picture on Tapestry to show you your child is happy playing after just a short time. Please be assured that if your child continued to be upset after a short time following drop off, staff would ask to speak with you to discuss how we can help with this transition. Please speak with the room leader or your child's key worker for reassurance.

 More sensory books being sent home. He's had a couple and really enjoyed being able to interact when we read to him.

It's great to hear that the new sensory books we purchased recently have been a big hit  $\odot$ , We will continue to try to expand the range we have available in our lending library in the coming months.

• Increase provision for children with SEN so that children have more opportunities to learn and development. This would also allow more parents to work if chosen to knowing the children are safe and in the best learning environment. It's this type of support the LA need to invest in as it's this support that makes a difference to the child and families in such a positive way.

We have a set number of places in Rainbow Room and are full each year, in fact we regularly have more applications than we have places! We do offer a limited number of additional hours for children attending our Rainbow Room, as well as breakfast and after school club, but these are taken in our mainstream Garden Room to ensure we have spaces to support lots of children with SEND and their families. We would certainly love to expand our specialist provision and offer even more places to families of children with SEND. It's something we are looking into, with support from the Local Authority, and we all have our fingers crossed for a positive outcome in the future  $\odot$
